Going Green is in our Nature

Investing in renewable energy, such as sunlight, wind or geothermal is gaining momentum thanks to the fantastic benefits they bring for both budgets and the environment.

Energy costs can be significantly reduced along with the associated carbon footprint. The Trust recently decided to invest in this technology as it is also part of living our values – demonstrating best practice to our members, the local community and businesses.

CORNWALL WILDLIFE TRUST

Following a £12,000 grant from the M&S Energy Fund and further funding from The Carbon Trust and Kenwyn Community Fund, we employed local experts ZLC Energy to help us with the initial planning, approval, design and installation of solar panels on the roof of one of our buildings at the Trust headquarters near Allet. The team carried out the work within a week and were all clearly enthusiastic about their work, believing strongly in the need for alternatives to coal, oil, gas or nuclear energy fuel sources.

Managing Director, ZLC Matthew Shepherd said: "It was a pleasure to work with the Trust on the solar PV installation. It is encouraging seeing that the organisation is making a positive step towards carbon reduction and wanting to generate clean, green energy for its use at its offices. We assessed a variety of options with the Trust and identified that solar PV was an obvious choice. We hope to continue working with them to help them reduce their energy costs further and promote the generation of clean renewable energies."

The solar array is likely to save the site up to £2,000 per year in energy costs. The installation will also provide an income of around £1,400 per year from Government incentives which together means that the Trust's income can be maximised for local conservation work.



The Trust's consultancy, CEC, has become a pioneer in Cornwall of a new benchmark for the design and maintenance of green infrastructure in housing and commercial development. The 'Building with Nature' scheme has been established to support the creation of high quality green infrastructure throughout, and beyond, the planning and development process.

Building with Nature provides an assessment and accreditation process, focusing on five core standards, with three key themes – Wellbeing, Water and Wildlife.

In May, CEC held a successful seminar at Heartlands to introduce and celebrate this exciting and innovative scheme, which ensures that nature is at the heart of building projects. Attendees included land owners, property developers, architects, planning officers and Trust Business Supporters.

Jenny Stuart, CEC's Principal Ecologist, is delighted to be a Building with Nature Assessor for Cornwall. She explains;

"To finally have something in place to recognise good quality green infrastructure for the construction sector to strive towards is absolutely fantastic. Working in the environment, we've been aware for many years that there is a vital need for better designed

green infrastructure in all developments not just for wildlife but for people too. It's been proven that new communities thrive in housing developments which have incorporated green spaces, trees, parks, playgrounds and even water features such as ponds or rivers. To have this accreditation scheme in place will add value

for everyone."

Planning and Sustainable

provided inspiring talks on the
