Responsibility

Public Events

Check hse.govuk for information about holding your event in a public place, and remember to obtain a licence if you are collecting money on the day in a public location!

Safety

Food & Drink

If you're providing refreshments, make sure you alert people to any allergens. food.gov.uk is a comprehensive website for food safety laws in the UK.
